

Our Gospel Today

Today's Gospel is a portion of the Sermon on the Mount, one of Jesus's most famous teachings in the New Testament. Jesus expands on the teachings of the law and the prophets, challenging his listeners to go beyond external obedience to the law and to live out its spirit in their hearts.


