

Palm Sunday 2023

The Gospel reading from Matthew 26:14-27:66 is commonly referred to as the Passion Narrative, and it describes the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and his eventual death on the cross. This passage is an important part of Christian theology as it highlights the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus made for humanity's salvation.

In the beginning, the reading describes Judas' betrayal of Jesus for thirty pieces of silver. This action sets in motion the events that lead to Jesus' crucifixion. Jesus then shares the Last Supper with his disciples and tells them that he will be betrayed and handed over to the authorities. He also institutes the sacrament of the Eucharist, where he gives his disciples bread and wine, telling them that they represent his body and blood.

Following this, Jesus goes to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray, where he is arrested by the soldiers of the high priest. He is then brought before the Sanhedrin, where he is falsely accused and condemned to death. This is followed by Peter's denial of Jesus three times, just as Jesus had predicted.

The narrative then moves to Jesus' trial before Pilate, the Roman governor, where he is once again accused and condemned to death. Pilate washes his hands of the matter, and Jesus is taken to be crucified, where he is mocked and taunted by the soldiers and the crowd.

Finally, Jesus dies on the cross, and his body is taken down and buried in a tomb. This passage ends with a guard being placed at the tomb to ensure that Jesus' body is not stolen.

The Passion Narrative in Matthew is significant because it shows Jesus' willingness to sacrifice himself for humanity's sins, as well as the political and religious tensions that led to his crucifixion. It also highlights the importance of faith and loyalty to Jesus, as demonstrated by the disciples' abandonment and Peter's denial.

Overall, this reading is a powerful reminder of the sacrifice that Jesus made for humanity, and it serves as a cornerstone of Christian faith and theology.
