We want to take this opportunity to update all parishioners on the work that has been ongoing in St John the Baptist Church Tyone since 2020. The main objective in undertaking the renovation work was for St John's to become both a centre for worship as well as a community hub for use by parishioners and other groups to develop and promote both faith and wellbeing. We are happy to confirm that the work on the Chapel included

- New altar, chair, and Ambo
- New carpeting for the Altar area and floor covering for the remainder of the Chapel area.
- Painting of the ceiling tiles,
- New lighting and sound system
- Curtain on back wall behind Altar
- Lighting behind cross on back wall
- Provision of a lockable retractable partition that will segregate the Chapel from the multipurpose area Monday to Friday and then enlarge the Chapel for weekend ceremonies.

The work in the multipurpose area has now been completed and included.

- New floor covering
- Painting of ceiling tiles.
- Provision of wheelchair accessible toilets
- Provision of Kitchenette.

Both areas are now complete and available for the intended purpose. Please contact the parish office for any further details.

His Holiness, Pope Francis, on **Globalisation and Rapidly Advancing** Technology

In today's world, the sense of belonging to a single human family is fading, and the dream of working together for justice and peace seems an outdated utopia. What reigns instead is a cool, comfortable and globalised indifference, born of deep disillusionment concealed behind a deceptive illusion: thinking that we are allpowerful, while failing to realise that we are all in the same boat. This illusion, unmindful of the great fraternal values, leads to "a sort of cynicism. For that is the temptation we face if we go down the road of disenchantment and disappointment... Isolation and withdrawal into one's own interests are never the way to restore hope and bring about renewal. Rather, it is closeness: it is the culture of encounter. Isolation, no; closeness, ves. Culture clash, no; culture of encounter, yes".

In this world that races ahead, yet lacks a shared roadmap, we increasingly sense that "the gap between concern for one's personal well-being and the prosperity of the larger human family seems to be stretching to the point of complete division between individuals and human community... It is one thing to feel forced to live together, but something entirely different to value the richness and beauty of those seeds of common life that need to be sought out and cultivated". Technology is constantly advancing, yet "how wonderful it would be if the growth of scientific and technological innovation could come with more equality and social inclusion. How wonderful would it be, even as we discover faraway planets, to rediscover the needs of the brothers and sisters who orbit around us".
