Trócaire - Lenten Reflections

Fourth Sunday in Lent

Our celebration of the Eucharist today begins with the
word 'rejoice'. As we go through the season of Lent, we are
given this day to focus on the transformation that is going
on within us. Lent is a time of letting things go because
we want to embrace the new life that Christ gives us. In
the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus, Jesus
says that change will come about through his death and
resurrection, and he will save the whole of world. 'Yes, God
loved the world so much that he gave his only son, so that
everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have
eternal life' (John 3:16). The change that comes about in a
person comes from deep within. It is not enough to know,
talk about or explain the actions of Jesus; we must believe
this in our hearts and from that knowledge comes the desire
to change and to embrace the love of God. The same is true
of the willingness of nations and individuals to embrace the
